E-safety and school website

In September, the DfE updated their Keeping Children Safe in Education document which informs all safeguarding updates in education. Online safety is a particular challenge especially for older children but also to any child who has online access 2

and the ability to use a search engine. Please read the recent update from Wirral LA below regarding an app causing current concern. We are aware that many of our families have older siblings and know that this will be useful information.

Safeguarding alert

On behalf of the Wirral Contextual Safeguarding and Compass teams we would like to alert you about the Yubo App. Previously known as Yellow, the Yubo app is extremely popular among teens. It mimics adult social media and dating apps like Tinder. It has been referred to by social media commentators as being a dating app for teens and as such there is scope for such a platform to be misused. Wirral's Contextual and Compass teams have seen a recent increase in children and young people using this app. This has resulted in some young people going to meet other peers through the app, potentially placing themselves at great risk of harm and abuse.
