Attendance

It is vital that your child attends school if they are well enough to do so. The KS1 gate in the morning opens at 8.40am and the Reception gate opens at 8.45am. Both gates close at 8.55am. It is important that your child is in school ready to learn at this time and does not miss vital learning. Thank you to all parents/carers who ensure that their child is in school on time each day.

Covid update 'Living with Covid'

Access to free COVID tests for most people ended last Friday. All community testing sites in Wirral have closed. Regular testing in mainstream education and childcare settings is no longer advised.

As with any other respiratory illness, staff members, children, pupils and students who are unwell and have a high temperature should stay at home and avoid contact with other people, where they can. They can go back to school, college or childcare when they no longer have a high temperature, and they are well enough to attend.

Anyone with a positive COVID test result should still be advised to stay at

home and avoid contact with other people for five days, which is when they are most infectious.

If a child or young person aged 18 or under tests positive for COVID-19, they should try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people for 3 days. This starts from the day after they did the test. Children and young people tend to be infectious to others for less time than adults. If they're well and do not have a temperature after 3 days, there's a much lower risk that they'll pass on COVID-19 to others.

The teachers in F1 and F2 also

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dressed up and shared many stories with their classes. Thank you for joining in with the theme of the day and promoting a love of reading with us at school.

<u>Parking</u>

As you already know, we have been made aware by our neighbours that some parents are parking dangerously outside of school at collection and drop off times. This must stop and everyone must be mindful of the fact that driveways must not blocked for access and that our young children deserve a safe entrance and exit to school.

New Exciting Project

We are excited to be working with "By Ours" which is a partnership project with Wirral Council, Liverpool City Region Combined Authority and Sustrans, funded by the Freshfield Foundation. The project aims to create streets that work for kids, young people and the communities they live in.

Working with schools from around the Bebington Area, Sustrans Project Officers will be working with pupils, staff, parents and the local community to look to identify ways the environment around schools and journeys to school can be made safer and more sustainable for children and families and residents.

We have taken part in the Sustrans <u>'Big Walk and Wheel'</u>. This is the UK's largest walking, wheeling, scooting and cycling to school challenge. Schools compete on each day of the competition to see who can record the greatest number of pupils travelling to school actively. If we can continue to do this then there will be less traffic around Town Lane and safer streets for all. In addition, the Y2 children completed <u>'The Big Street Survey'</u> with a member of the Sustrans team where they surveyed the traffic at different locations and at different times. More information will follow soon.

Year 1 Visit

The Y1 visit to Christ Church, Bebington was a great success and the children experienced the story of Easter starting from Palm Sunday. There were 6 stations for the children to visit including the washing of the feet, the Last Supper, Jesus praying in the garden, Jesus dying on the cross and the empty tomb when Jesus had risen.
