We have also had a few cases of Scarlet Fever and we are monitoring this closely with advice from Public Health.

Anti- Bulling Week

As you know, Anti Bullying week took place between 14-18th November. Thank you to those parents who took the time to respond to our survey. After analysing the results from our parent questionnaire, we are pleased to report that 100% of parents feel that our school creates a caring and safe environment for children and that we help children to feel safe in school. 93% of parents feel that bulling is dealt with appropriately, feel confident to report bullying to a member of staff and feel they have been supported when dealing with specific incidents. We would like to reinforce to all parents that we take this very

seriously and to remind you all that our policy is located on the school website and paper copies are available from the office.

UN Convention for the rights of the child

Article 3 (best interests of the child) The best interests on the child must be a top priority in all decisions and actions that affect children

Article 12 (respect for the views of the child) Every child has the right to express their views, feelings and wishes in all matters affecting them, and to have their views considered and taken seriously. This right applies at all times

Article 28 (right to education) Every child has the right to an education.

Article 29 (goals of education) Education must develop every child's personality, talents and abilities to the full. It must encourage the child's respect for human rights, as well as respect for their parents, their own and other cultures, and the environment

Article 31 (leisure, play and culture) Every child has the right to relax, play and take part in a wide range of cultural and artistic activities.
