# Town Lane Infant School Newsletter

### Attendance

As you know, we monitor attendance regularly and it is of importance that your child attends school regularly and that they arrive on time. Our phonics lessons begin at 9am prompt and we do not want children missina this **important** learning time. In addition, the Y2 children will be taking part in statutory assessments starting next week and so must be in school to do so.

# Y2 Standard Assessment Tests (SATs) More information

During the month of May, Y2 children take part in the statutory assessment process and will complete SAT papers. This is an independent assessment which the children take part in within their own classrooms. Year 2 children will be tested reading mathematics. Although the tests are set externally, they will be marked by teachers within school. Once completed, children will be given a

standardised score. Teacher assessments will also be used to build up a picture of your child's learning and achievements. In addition, your child will receive an overall result saying whether they have achieved the required standard at the end of the year. Please ensure your child attends school every day in order to fully benefit from the work class teachers are doing to prepare the children for their end of key stage assessments.

#### **Royal Celebrations**

This week, we have all been joining in the celebrations for the Coronation of our new King that will take place on Saturday at Westminster Abbey. The children dressed in their finest clothes on Wednesday and many enjoyed a traditional lunch of fish and chips outside on the field. Thank you for joining in with the theme and helping us to mark this very special occasion.

We managed to locate the very first log book for Town Lane Infant School and were able to share this historic artefact with the children. This book marks the very first day our school opened to pupils in 1939 and even has information recorded about the day of the late Queen's Coronation. The Y2 children were fascinated to find out how the children at Town Lane in the past celebrated this occasion when they were at school.

Anger — if your child is feeling angry, give them some strategies to use such as pushing against the wall, clapping hands together as fast as you can or squeeze a teddy bear tight to release their frustration.

UN Convention for the rights of the child

Article 3 (best interests of the child) The best interests on the child must be a top priority in all decisions and actions that affect children

Article 12 (respect for the views of the child) Every child has the right to express their views, feelings and wishes in all matters affecting them, and to have their views considered and taken seriously. This right applies at all times

Article 28 (right to education) Every child has the right to an education.

Article 29 (goals of education) Education must develop every child's personality, talents and abilities to the full. It must encourage the child's respect for human rights, as well as respect for their parents, their own and other cultures, and the environment

Article 31 (leisure, play and culture) Every child has the right to relax, play and take part in a wide range of cultural and artistic activities.
