Emotional Literacy Support

Mrs. Austin is our Emotional Literacy Support Assistant (ELSA) within school and has been an invaluable support to many families over the years. Since September, she has provided ELSA involvement with 21 children. This has been via group work, one to one work and supporting children within their classes. She also supports staff and sends advice and resources home for parents. Mrs. Austin is requesting any parental feedback forms to be returned to school, for her

attention, as soon as possible or if anyone has any feedback for her to email the school office.

We would like to also remind you that there are many resources available from Mrs. Austin on our website relating to various areas of support within the ELSA section. Wellbeing Wonder

Diary writing – if your child is struggling with some difficult feelings, ask them to write or draw how they are feeling and why which can initiate a conversation and help you to understand.

UN Convention for the rights of the child Article 3 (best interests of the child) The best interests on the child must be a top priority in all decisions and actions that affect children

Article 12 (respect for the views of the child) Every child has the right to express their views, feelings and wishes in all matters affecting them, and to have their views considered and taken seriously. This right applies at all times

Article 28 (right to education) Every child has the right to an education.

Article 29 (goals of education) Education must develop every child's personality, talents and abilities to the full. It must encourage the child's respect for human rights, as well as respect for their parents, their own and other cultures, and the environment

Article 31 (leisure, play and culture) Every child has the right to relax, play and take part in a wide range of cultural and artistic activities.
