Attendance



Attendance at school is high priority for all of our children. It has been wonderful to see so many children arriving at school on time over the last few days and showing that they are ready to learn after being reunited with their friends.

Please can we remind you about the information from the DfE about attendance. There is wide agreement among health professionals and educational professionals that school attendance is vital to the life chances of children and young people. Being in school improves wellbeing health. and socialisation throughout the life course. The greatest benefits come from children and young people attending school regularly. It is usually appropriate for parents and carers to send their children to school with mild respiratory illnesses. This would include general cold symptoms: a minor cough,

runny nose or sore throat. However, children should not be sent to school if they have a temperature of 38°C or above. In addition to respiratory illnesses, we are aware that more children may be absent from school due to symptoms of anxiety than before the pandemic. Worry and mild or moderate anxiety, whilst sometimes difficult emotions, can be a normal part of growing up for many children and young people. Being in school can often help alleviate the underlying issues. Α prolonged period of absence is likely to heighten a child's anxiety about attending in the future, rather than reduce it.

Wellbeing Wonder



Calm time – create a calm box for your child to help them to learn to self-soothe. Place items in which help them when feeling upset or angry, such as their favourite book, a fidget toy, teddy bear, colouring book and crayons or lavender drops on a tissue.

UN Convention for the rights of the child Article 3 (best interests of the child) The best interests on the child must be a top priority in all decisions and actions that affect children

Article 12 (respect for the views of the child) Every child has the right to express their views, feelings and wishes in all matters affecting them, and to have their views considered and taken seriously. This right applies at all times

Article 28 (right to education) Every child has the right to an education.

Article 29 (goals of education) Education must develop every child's personality, talents and abilities to the full. It must encourage the child's respect for human rights, as well as respect for their parents, their own and other cultures, and the environment

Article 31 (leisure, play and culture) Every child has the right to relax, play and take part in a wide range of cultural and artistic activities.
